## Summary Duties

In connection with miscellaneous construction, alteration and repair activities at various locations in the Power System, operates machine tools, and working from blueprints or sketches, overhauls and repairs heavy duty power tools and equipment which are in need of repair while being used on current jobs; inspects and repairs heavy duty tools and equipment at expiration of jobs before their return to stock; does machine shop fabricating, including the making of form bolts, brackets and clamps, threading pipes, nipples and bolts, and grinding drills; overhauls gas-driven equipment such as generators and sump pumps, air drills and grinders, hydraulic jacks and fenders, and duplex pumps; makes all necessary repairs to machinery and equipment in the machine and carpenter shop of the construction headquarters; orders repair parts and machine shop supplies; instructs helpers; inspects completed work before it is sent to the field for use; occasionally repairs, overhauls, modifies and installs machinery and equipment at construction sites and in existing facilities; prepares job cards showing material used and time consumed on each job; occasionally drives motor vehicles; and performs related duties.

## 1. Overtime:

a. Erection and Construction Work: An employee shall be compensated for the first three hours outside the regularly scheduled shift and the first eight hours on Saturday at the one and one-half (1½) time rate. Sundays, holidays and all additional hours of overtime work will be compensated at the double (2) time rate of pay.

b. Maintenance and Repair Work: Employees performing maintenance and repair work shall be paid double (two times) the regular straight-time hourly rate for all time worked in excess of the regular daily schedule of hours; and double time (two times) for all time worked on Saturdays and Sundays.

# 2. <u>Holidays</u>:

Holidays shall be as follows: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When a holiday falls on Sunday, the day observed by the State or Nation shall be observed as a holiday.

#### 4. Show-up:

Employees who report for work as instructed and who are not put to work shall receive four (4) hours pay at the regular straight-time hourly rate, except in cases of inclement weather, equipment breakdown, or other conditions beyond the control of the Department. Employees who begin work shall receive at least four (4) hours pay unless they voluntarily quit, or are discharged for cause, or are laid off because of conditions beyond the control of the Department.

# 5. Multiple Shift: (8 - 7% - 7%)

When two or more shifts are established, the second and third shifts shall be established on a seven and one-half  $(7\frac{1}{2})$  hour day, thirty-seven and one-half  $(37\frac{1}{2})$  hour week basis. The pay for a full shift on each of the above shifts shall be for eight (8) times the hourly wages herein provided. (Eff. 12/31/92.)

#### 6. Subsistence

When a job is located seventy-five (75) or more miles from Los Angeles, an employee shall receive a subsistence payment of \$35.00 per day worked, provided that on a job that is of one day's duration and for which an employee is paid (or furnished) transportation and travel time to and from the job, he shall not, in addition, receive a subsistence payment. No employee residing in the area in which the job is located shall receive subsistence payment.

#### 7. Travel and Transportation:

When an employee is required to report to a job site in excess of 75 miles from Los Angeles City Hall, he shall receive payments as specified below:

(a) On the first and last day of consecutive workdays he shall be entitled to receive a transportation and travel payment of 24 cents per mile, provided that an employee

shall not be entitled to transportation and travel time payments when an interruption in consecutive workdays is caused by Saturdays, Sundays, holidays, or weather conditions.

- (b) On a job of one day's duration or less, an employee shall be entitled to receive a transportation and travel time payment to and from the job.
- (c) An employee who voluntarily quits before he has worked ten (10) working days, or is discharged with just and sufficient cause prior to the completion of the job, will not be entitled to return transportation and travel allowance.
- (d) An employee shall receive paid travel time at the straight-time hourly rate computed at the rate of 50 miles per hour for time spent traveling to the job site from the designated point on the first day of work and from the site on the last day of work.
